

St. James Five Wins 'Y' Church League Title

In a game in which it trailed for three quarters and then saw the lead change hands seven times in the final eight minutes of play, St. James Episcopal church won its third Birmingham YMCA Church league championship by defeating Christ Church of Cranbrook 85 to 33.

With 25 seconds to play, John Burton of St. James was fouled as he drove in for a lay-up shot. He sank the first of two free throws and elected to take the second out of bounds. This gave St. James control of the ball and a screen play freed Burton for his winning shot.

HENDRIX, MADDOX, Koella, Hooper, and Trichel were outstanding for Christ Church while Lance and Burton kept St. James in the battle. Half-time score was 19 to 11 in favor of Christ church, who gradually diminished when Koella, tall, lanky center for the Bloomfield Hills boys, was ejected after committing five personal fouls.

With the score tied at 25 points each, Bob Pope sank a free throw to give St. James a one-point lead at the opening of the fourth quarter. This was short lived as Hooper scored from under the basket for Christ Church to put the Blue in front.

Minor net scored for St. James and the exchange of baskets continued until Burton sank his free throw.

ST. JAMES will represent Birmingham in the Metropolitan League Church league play-offs at the Downtown YMCA Tuesday, March 20, when it meets Redford Baptist at 7 p.m. in the Intermediate Boys 'A' Division.

Either Lathrop Townsite or First Presbyterian church will be Birmingham's representative in the 'B' division.

Engineering Dept. To Design New Redding Road Sewer

City Manager Donald C. Egbert's recommendation that the engineering department design a new sewer to serve Redding, east of the bridge was approved by the city commission Monday evening.

Egbert also recommended that the plans together with estimates of the cost be reported to the commission to form the basis of a new assessment district.

The proposed construction of the Redding road sewer was first initiated by a resolution passed Jan. 6, 1947. The assessment roll was received that May and a hearing set that same month.

Egbert reported that at this hearing there was substantial objection from the property owners, and the roll was returned to the assessor for further consideration. Since that time, however, a change in the construction of the sewer has been found necessary.
