**Long-Range Road Program Needed, Barnard Claims**

A long-range road program is needed in Troy township, according to Norman R. Barnard, present township clerk and Republican candidate for supervisor.

"The factor needing most urgent attention is ditching and drainage," Barnard stated. "He said, 'The factor needing most urgent attention is ditching and drainage. It is obvious that the continual expenditure of monies from an already inadequate road maintenance budget for graveling and surfacing is an inefficient use of taxpayers money unless the fundamental of drainage is solved first.'"

THE CANDIDATE feels that road and highway maintenance hasn't kept pace with the rate of residential development and he believes the problem must be recognized as one requiring all financially possible attention at once, coupled with a long range maintenance and improvement program.

Barnard said, "Such a long range program should immediately be developed and followed up, so that the present neglected condition of many of our subdivision and mile roads will not occur again."

Since 1938, road maintenance has been a duty of the county road commission; however, Barnard believes it is the responsibility of township officials to alert themselves to the needs of the area and to actively co-operate with the county road commission in every manner possible to obtain better roads in Troy township.

**Household Workers' Report Due in April**

Does your maid work at least 24 different days in a calendar quarter?  
Is she paid \$50 or more in cash wages in a calendar quarter?

If your answer to both of these questions is "Yes," then she comes under social security and her social security tax will be due in April.

Rex A. C. Atwood, manager of the Pontiac field office of the Social Security administration, has reminded household employers that since Jan. 1, 1951, maids, cooks, butlers, laundresses, chauffeurs (of privately owned cars), gardeners, nursemaids, companions, and even baby sitters are now under Social Security if they work on at least 24 days in a calendar quarter for cash wages of \$50 during the same quarter.

THE CURRENT RATE of the social security is three per cent shared equally by the employer and the employee—1 1/2 per cent deducted from the employee pay and 1 1/2 per cent contributed by the employer. It is payable quarterly to the collector of Internal Revenue within 30 days of the end of the calendar quarter.

Atwood explains that the reporting procedure for household employees has been simplified so that there will be no complicated record keeping or burdensome tax returns. If an employer has business employees for whom he is reporting social security taxes, he may include his household employees in his business return.

Or he may use the special simplified form which when folded becomes an envelope for mailing the tax.

The envelope form contains such information as employer's name and address, period covered by the return, in addition to social security account number, name, and the amount of wages paid to each employee.

A brief booklet, which explains the requirements to be met by household workers in order to come under social security, is available at the social security office, 1225 Hubbard Building, Pontiac, at the local post office, or from any internal revenue office. A post card attached to the booklet is to be used in obtaining the special tax return blank.


