Contract Awarded For Construction Of Water Mains

The George Odien firm's \$130,702.75 bid on construction of water mains was accepted by the city commission Monday evening. The contract was awarded contingent on the sale of bonds to finance the project.

City Engineer L. R. Gare stated that the construction will start in about a month and should be completed this fall.

Mains will be constructed on Cranbrook from Lincoln to Midvale; Chesterfield from Redding to Maple; Maple from Chesterfield to Bates; Chester from Maple to Lincoln; 14 Mile, Bates to Pierce; Maple from Woodward to Hunter; Kinross from the water tank to Adams.

to Maple; Maple from Adams to Dixie; Pierce from 14 mile to Lincoln; and three short sections on Hunter between Maple and Haynes.
