John Christian von Hund Conrad, son of Dr. and Mrs. Cecil

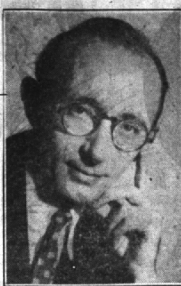

CLIFFORD CURZON

The Community Concert Association of Southern Oklahoma and County will present their fourth concert on Monday evening, March 26th, at 8:15 p.m. in the Royal Oak High School Auditorium. The artist will be the English pianist Clifford Curzon who conquered this country twice having first arrived in New York early in 1939. He won not only high critical acclaim but a tour-contract for the following season. The war came and it was almost nine years before he reached these shores again. His "second

debut" in the autumn of 1947 was with the New York Philharmonic-Ochestra at Carnegie Hall under Dimitri Mitropoulos. Playing the Tschakowsky Concerto, followed shortly after by a Town Hall recital. Little Gallery is located on East Maple, and the hours are ten to five daily, except Wednesday and Sunday, when the gallery is closed.
