

**Budget Report Submitted For SOC Hospital**

Preliminary draft of the 1951-52 operating expenses of the South Oakland hospital authority shows a total proposed expenditure of \$352,267.76.

This amount includes personal and contractual services, materials and supplies, fixed charges, architectural and legal fees and contingent fund.

The adjourned annual meeting of the hospital authority will be held Thursday, March 29 at 7:30 p.m. in the Royal Oak city hall. Purpose of the session is to discuss and approve the report.

Birmingham's share of the budget would be \$3,559.53 if it is approved. It is based on a one-tenth of a mill assessment.

**TAXES**

**How to Keep Them Reasonable**

Why do people keep asking for Municipal, State and Federal subsidies which indirectly are translated into special services that can be furnished more economically by private business? Have we not seen that on a State and National basis, too much of your and my money has been dissipated through so-called taxes for Park Bureau projects under the thin disguise of doing something of great benefit for all?

Since the first World War this has been going on apace, with the inevitable result of a populace over-burdened, not with Real Taxes, but with disguised SIGHT DRAFTS tacked at us from every direction. I leave it to your imagination the ratio of REAL BENEFITS to the financial degeneration of a great nation.

Let's find out what our Real Taxes (City, State and National) amount to and then take steps towards ending this creeping paralysis of our financial muscles. As for me, I would like to know WHY there is such a difference in School taxes on two pieces of property of the same Fair Market value—one located in Birmingham, and the other located in one of the surrounding townships. If you will take the time to investigate, you will find that the County Equalization Board has tabbed some of us for a disproportionate share of the cost of our school system.

Our City Commission, through the City Assessor is supposed to represent Birmingham taxpayers. Taxes are taxes no matter how or by whom they are levied. I ask the fair question: Why has this condition been allowed to exist without the fullest publicity?

A start can be made by the NEXT Commission towards giving FULLST PUBLICITY to all tax matters and especially to Operating and Projected Capital Improvements periodically, so that an INFORMED public will either be thoroughly aroused or serenely confident that all is well.

This matter of Taxes constitutes the most important plank in my platform. I, too, like to spend money for useful purposes but, in all contiguity and with a sincere desire to be of some service to my fellow citizens, I would be remiss if I did not ask you to elect three other candidates on April 2nd who will have the intestinal Fortitude to spend my money for any purpose other than a reasonable OPERATIVE Budget unless such projects, WITHIN THEMSELVES, affirm that:

1. They are in the interest of Public Health.
2. That they are in the interest of Public Safety.
3. That they are in the interest of needed Educational facilities.
4. That they are in the Real Interest of the Public at Large.

To go beyond these four major governmental functions means a dangerous overlapping into the realm of Private Business with resultant chaotic tax situation such as we have today in all of the larger Cities of our Country—and especially in our National Government.

Truly, in the larger political arena, we have almost lost the Power of Choice.

Are you as citizens of Birmingham going to let it happen here?

**Injunction Delays Fire Hall Plans In Southfield**

A temporary injunction was served on the Southfield township board Tuesday evening forbidding it to start construction on two fire halls.

Board members were scheduled to open bids for the construction of the halls at that meeting and approximately seven bids were received.

After receiving the injunction, the board voted to return the bids unopened.

**THE SUIT** was started by A. E. Jensen, who claims he did so to be of some service to the taxpayers. The plans are in excess of \$200,000 and the township would be a financial burden on taxpayers. Another reason given by Jensen was that the township has only acquired one building site.

Jensen has been a supporter for more fire halls for some time. Last September township voters provided that the two halls should be constructed by December 1951.

In other business, Township Clerk Mrs. Fannie Adams was authorized to advertise for bids for construction of sidewalks in Birwood subdivision. Bids will be opened April 24.

Resignation of Bert Gale as township assessor was accepted, effective March 31.
