Maple Cagers Take District Title With 42-31 Victory over Clawson

Birmingham chalked up a 42-31 victory over Clawson Friday night in the final round of the district tournaments at Berkeley to become the seventh consecutive Maple squad to win the district crown.

Maple Coach Lloyd Cooper had a remarkable record in district competition since coming to Birmingham eight seasons ago. Only once has a Cooper coached team failed to win the district championship, the sole exception coming his first season.

ONE OF THE determining factors in the Maple victory was the successful bottling up of Clawson forward Chuck Shields, who scored 30 points against Warren earlier in the week. Shields was held to 11 markers before fouling out with three minutes left to play.

Top Birmingham scorer, Barry Wall led with 18 tallies for the locals. In the third quarter, after trailing by a narrow margin all the way, Clawson staged what looked like the beginning of an all out drive. Shields scored twice in rapid succession, and guard Jerry Manconr immediately followed, bringing the Trojans to within four points of Birmingham with a 25-21 score.

IN THE LAST MINUTE of the quarter, the Maples pulled away to a seven point lead, killing any further Clawson threat. In the final period every varsity regular saw action.

Earlier last week the Maples earned the chance to meet Clawson in the championship round by defeating tourney host Berkeley 54-27 in the opening round.

Wall scored 12 points, followed closely by ten and forward Art Fairbanks with nine. In the last quarter Cooper cleared the bench, and the game
