A public hearing to discuss a request for rezoning of a 350-acre parcel between Northwest, Evergreen and Nine Mile will be held at the Southfield school, Ten Mile and Berg roads at 8 p.m. Thursday, April 5, according to Joseph Rankin, secretary of the Southfield township zoning board.
