## Red Cross Drive



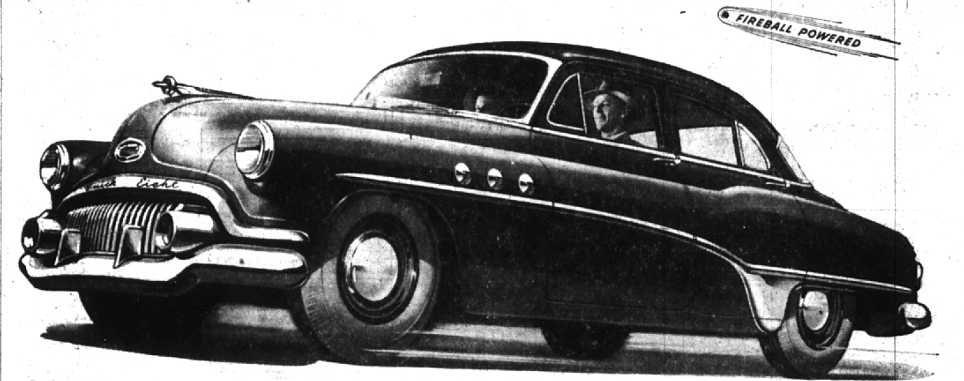
