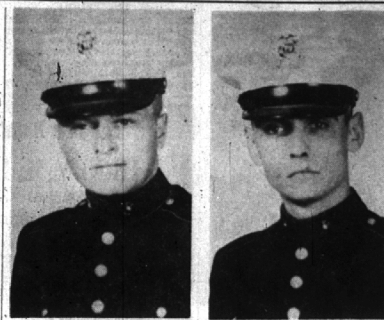
The sidewalk will be replaced in its proper relationship with the trees and will provide a adequate parkway strip between the sidewalk and the curb.

"White Cane" Week Noted by Lions Club

* Through special proclamation of Gov. G. Mennen Williams, "White Cane" week is being observed in Michigan May 6-12, sponsored by the state's Lions clubs.

During the past year the Birmingham club, through aid to the blind, has supplied 40 pairs of glasses to school children referred to them by the St. Joseph clinic in Pontiac and Birmingham school nurses.

They also have given \$90 for eye treatment for elderly persons unable to attend the clinic. Another \$200 has been given to the Leader Dog League for the Blind at Rochester.

Local cases are referred to the Lions club from the school and city nurses, Community House and the Family Service office here. Eye tests for Birmingham school children are made on the Massachusetts vision testing equipment supplied by the Lions club several years ago.

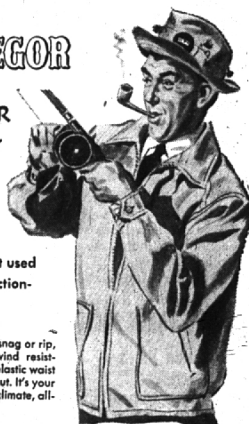

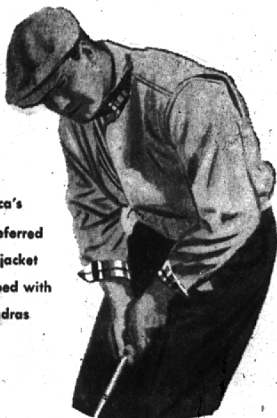
