Maple Thinclads Surprise Victors Over Ferndale

Coach Lloyd Cooper's Birmingham high school track squad pulled a major upset Tuesday when it defeated Ferndale, defending Eastern Michigan League champions, 57 1/2 to 51 1/2 on the Rail-splitters track.

The victory makes two wins and two losses for the Maples this season with decided improvement evident in all departments.

Outstanding performers were Bruce Armstrong, Ferndale, first in the 440 in :52.9 and anchor man on the winning 880 relay in 1:37.3; Rich Hindley, 150 high hurdles, 16.5; George Rockwell, mile, 4:57.6; Jack Hooper, 200 in 2:18.6; Dave Bowen, shot put, 42'11"; Ken Worde, pole vault, ten feet; all Birmingham; and the Maple medley relay consisting of Art Fairbanks, Lance Minor, Jim Newman, Ned Sharples won in 2:40.2.

Birmingham started slow this year because the team could not work on the track for sometime because of weather conditions after Easter vacation. But Coach Cooper has made up this difference, and the boys rounded into shape fast.

City's Share of E. Maple Paving Contract Awarded

The city's portion of the asphaltic concrete surfacing on East Maple between Adams and Eton has been awarded to the A and A Asphalt Paving Co. in the amount of \$9,416.50. The bid was approved by the city commission Monday evening.

In addition, Leon Belkan, engineer-manager of the county road commission has recommended to his commission that the city's share of the work be awarded to the same firm for its bid of \$17,866.50.

Combined total for the two bids is \$27,283. Paving is expected to start in about two weeks.
