The monthly business meeting of the Baldwin public library board will be held at 8 p.m., May 17 at the library auditorium.

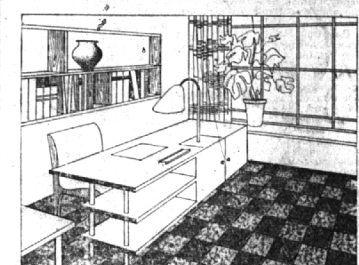
