will be awarded Arthur Lake, Dr. Robert Mason, George Forester and 1950 members of the Birmingham Committee of Management for volunteer service rendered.

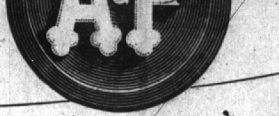
The 'Y' Committee will nap plans for its fall membership campaign and hear progress reports from the building committee.
