A letter from Robert D. Savage, 935 Stanley, told of the speed with which the department arrived when his family returned home to find the house filled with smoke.

"The department was there in about a minute," he said. "The fireman in charge located the cause, a burned out refrigerator motor, notified his station that it

was under control and cleared our home of smoke. He also made a complete inspection of our house for other signs of danger. It is most reassuring to know we have so fine a department."

COMMISSIONER Frank Rising spoke of the work of "these policemen" in handling traffic at the Pierce-Maple intersection Saturday.

"The department is to be complimented," he said. "Traffic is heavy and there are a great many people, especially tourists and children, crossing there.

"I tried directing traffic for a few minutes after the officer left and felt I was pretty lucky to get out of there with my life."

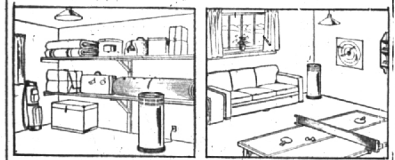

Local 'Y' Plans Summer Program

Program features of the Birmingham YMCA Da-Y summer program are rapidly rounding into shape and a complete calendar schedule will be released by June 1, according to Ed Kirbert, local 'Y' secretary.

Theme of the 'Y' program will be "An Adventure a Day with the Birmingham YMCA." Groups will operate from the 'Y' office and have a variety of experiences over a six weeks' period from June 22 until Aug. 3.

TRIPS WILL BE taken through industrial plants, museums, places of historical interest including a four day trip to Kentucky and the blue grass region with Mammoth Cave one of the stops to be visited.

Three excursions to Briggs Stadium are listed, and a commuter's trip on the Grand Trunk Railroad is one feature. Picnics and visits to nearby lakes and an opportunity to visit Chicago are included.

Boys and girls eight through 13 are eligible to join the group. The 'Y' maintains a home-pickup service operating Monday through Friday.

Only a limited number may register for special programs, and trip programs are open to any boy and girl in Birmingham.

Resolution Adopted By City Concerning County Drains

A resolution adopted by the city commission Monday evening guarantees payment for a survey in the event a special assessment district is not created and work does not proceed on the proposed drains for South Oakland County.

Under the terms of the resolution, Birmingham would assume a possible liability of \$1,407 in connection with a survey for the drains, which is estimated to cost \$30,000.

Commissioner Ralph Main stated, "The original sewers are not designed for the roof area drainage we have at the present time. It is necessary for some interceptors to be put in and take away some of the load on the present sewers. In addition, some of the present drains are backing up."

City Water Supply For Scout Cabin

Having abandoned the old well which has furnished water for the Girl Scout cabin at Springdale Park, Scout council members have asked the city to pipe water into the cabin for use of campers.

It was pointed out that the cabin will be used extensively during the next few weeks for over-night trips and a water supply is imperative.

City Manager Donald C. Egbert was authorized to act on the request.

Expenses will be paid from the forestry and parks fund.

Commission Approves Memorial Day Fund

Commissioners approved the Memorial Day committee's request for a special fund, the amount not to exceed \$100, subject to approval of bills.

The money is to be used to defray expenses of graves-decorations, the speaker and other expenses incidental to the annual celebration.
