Prof. Samuel Dana To Be LWV's Guest At Open Meeting

Dr. Samuel T. Dana, dean of the School of Natural Resources, University of Michigan, will speak at a public meeting of the Birmingham League of Women Voters meeting on May 21 at 1:30 p.m. at the Community House. He will also discuss recommendations made by the Hoover commission regarding conservation services.

Before coming to the University of Michigan in 1927, Dr. Dana was director of the Northeastern forest experimental station and forest commissioner for the state of Maine. He was also a member of the forest research and forest service in Washington, D. C., and is now president of the Society of American Foresters and editor-in-chief of the Journal of Forestry.

MEMBERS HOPE, through Dr. Dana's information, to clarify ideas on what service the League can render in forwarding possible legislation resulting from the Hoover commission's report on conservation.

The meeting is sponsored by the International Affairs committee, Mrs. W. W. Williams, chairman; Economics committee, Mrs. C. W. Robertson, and the committee on conservation, headed by Mrs. John S. Lambie.
