City to Acquire 10-Foot Strip

The city commission has approved the acquiring of a 10-foot strip from the property of Dr. H. Wilson Mitchell, 1128 W. 8th Maple, so the right-of-way can be extended.

The city will pay \$800 for the property, and also construct a driveway entrance to meet the proper grade at the new property line. The acquisition will permit a parkway strip approximately 10 feet in width on each side of a six-foot sidewalk and allow for a 44-foot pavement.

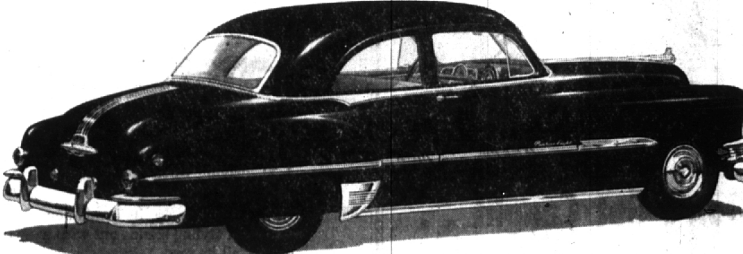

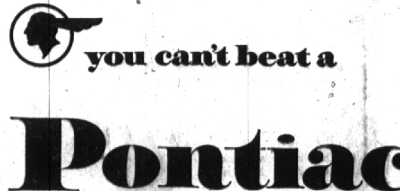
