**Traffic Toll to Begin Climbing On Memorial Day**

An average of more than 30 persons will be killed on Michigan highways each week-end between Memorial Day and Labor Day if traffic fatalities continue, according to State Police Commissioner Donald S. Leonard.

Last year an average of 18 met deaths each week-end, Friday through Sunday, in the months of June, July and August. During this three-month period a total of 490 persons were killed, and 237, or 55 per cent, died on week-ends.

A State Police traffic expert report for the first three months of 1951 shows a 24 per cent increase in traffic deaths over last year. The number of registered motor vehicles and total travel likewise climbed considerably.

Leonard pointed out that nearly half of all traffic violations reported in fatal accidents during June, July and August of last year involved excessive speed, or driving too fast for conditions. Rural areas accounted for 72 per cent of the deaths.

"MEMORIAL DAY marks the beginning of an upward surge in travel which continues until Labor Day," Leonard said. "As Memorial Day comes on a mid-week day this year it eliminates the possibility of an extended holiday weekend for many persons. Traffic, however, will be extremely heavy over the holiday."

"State Police will maintain maximum highway patrols in order to keep the Memorial Day traffic toll at a minimum and at the same time get off to a good start in establishing a summer time safety record, all motorists and pedestrians must cooperate by taking added precautions."

"Don't hurry, stay with the normal flow of traffic and be on the alert at all times. Head of the upward trend in traffic fatalities."

"During the 1950 four-day Memorial holiday period 24 persons were killed in Michigan traffic accidents. The all-time high for this period was 58 in 1941, and the all-time low was five in 1944."

**Residents Hear Sen. Blair Coody In Ferndale Talk**

Sen. Blair Coody, in his first public appearance in this area since his appointment to that office, told a Ferndale audience last Friday evening that the United States is facing the most critical time of its history.

The former Detroit News correspondent, speaking under the sponsorship of the Ferndale board of education and the Detroit Foreign Policy association said the next 18 months will be the most dangerous for the country, since we are building our strength under the threat of sinister plans of the Kremlin.

"WE SHOULD beware of four great dangers," he said. "The first great essential is that we must aim at keeping our European allies. If lost to the Russians, the European industrial potential would make defense of the western hemisphere extremely difficult."

"Secondly, we must do everything possible to stop inflation. The Kremlin knows this and hopes that our increased armaments which their policy has forced on us, will undermine our American economy."

"Thirdly, we must not relax to the very real and concrete dangers

which surround us and the other western democracies.

"FOURTHLY, we must apply world facts objectively. We should insist on clear, truthful information regarding the real facts of the situation."

Sen. Coody was honored at a reception at the home of Mrs. John Benson, executive vice-president of the Foreign Policy association.

Among those present were Dr. E. T. Hatt, Cranbrook, Dr. and Mrs. A. Stanley Cain, of Ann Arbor and formerly of Birmingham and Mr. and Mrs. Eugene Hess of Birmingham.

**Southfield Zoning Board Calls Public Hearing June 7**

A public hearing has been called by the Southfield township zoning board for Thursday, June 7 at 8 p.m. at the Southfield 10 school, 10 Mile and Berg roads, to consider a change in the zoning ordinance.
