Senator Vandenberg calling from Washington, I was informed.

IN BRIEF, this is what he said: "As you know, George, my old friend and former admiral Elton Eaton is running against me this year on the Republican ticket. I know, and I believe Elton does, too, that he can't beat me. I'm mighty busy down here in Washington, and really don't want to take time out to come back to Michigan to make a few speeches in answer to what Elton may say.

"You are one of Elton's best friends—will you get left with him and endeavor to get him to withdraw from the campaign?"

"Certainly, Art, I'll contact him at once and let you know within a day or two," I replied.

Well, to make a long story short, I immediately called Elton and arranged to meet him for lunch in Detroit the next day. In the meantime, I pondered the fact that Elton's service in the public interest, I pondered the idea of going after the Lieut. Governor instead of U. S. Senatorship.

THIS BROUGHT results the next day when I met Elton—especially when I promised Elton that if he withdrew, the Senator would say something on his behalf.

Elton agreed, so I got Senator Vandenberg on the telephone, told of my conversation with Elton, then asked: I promised Elton that, if he withdrew as your opponent, you'd approve him as a Republican candidate for Lieut. Governor this year—how about it?"

"You tell Elton I'll be happy to do so," he chuckled back over the telephone. Whereupon I said: "Tell him yourself, Art—he's here with me right now."

That was how Elton graciously withdrew in 1940 as an opponent of Senator Vandenberg. However, because Roosevelt and the Democrats won in Michigan that year.

IN MY thirty years of friendship with Senator Vandenberg, I never asked him for a single favor (which I rather think he appreciated) except in 1932 when I organized a group of Michigan editors to spend an evening in the White House with President and Mrs. Herbert Hoover.

The Senator arranged the affair, which was held in the famous Lincoln study on the second floor of the Executive Mansion.

On numerous occasions, when in Washington, I dropped into the Senator's office for a chat. I think it was in 1945 when, in answer to my question: "Do you intend to run for re-election in 1948?" he answered: "I don't think so. I am currently of the mind to retire and will try to recoup a bit more of economic security for myself and my family."

BUT, HE DIDN'T, of course. The turn in world events with the winning of the war, the formation of the United Nations in which he played a prominent part, plus his bi-partisan leadership in the Senate, caused him to continue his efforts in the public interest.

Senator Vandenberg was a vigorous, active man. There is little doubt that his tremendous activities, from early youth to a year ago, played havoc with his health; especially was this true during the past 10 years.

His place in Congress will be hard to fill.

But the record of his public activities, the memory of his many great utterances, will serve to inspire honest men and women who follow him.
