Crane Thinclads Defeat Kennedy

Cranebrook's track team scored its third and fourth victories of the season last week by defeating Birmingham High school Tuesday and Kennedy Collegiate of Windsor, Ont., Friday.

With Bob Kirk, Jan Simpson and Pete Macomber each scoring double wins, the Blue and Gray defeated the Kennedy squad 67-51. Kirk won both the low and high hurdles and ran the anchor leg on the victorious 880 relay team.

Simpson added a third place in the broad jump to victories in the 220 and the 100 yard dash, while Macomber won the shot put and the discus. However, the outstanding performance of the team was rendered by Kennedy's Bill Jennings as he ran a 54.3 quarter mile.

On the previous Tuesday afternoon, the Cranebrook defeated Baldwin for the first time in seven years in a dual meet. High point man Jan Simpson and runner-up Bob Kirk made a total of 26 2/3 points as Cranebrook scored 66 points to Birmingham's 43.
