Legion home, South Woodward. Cy Miller, Rochester, past commander of the council, will summarize and report on present legislation as it concerns veterans.

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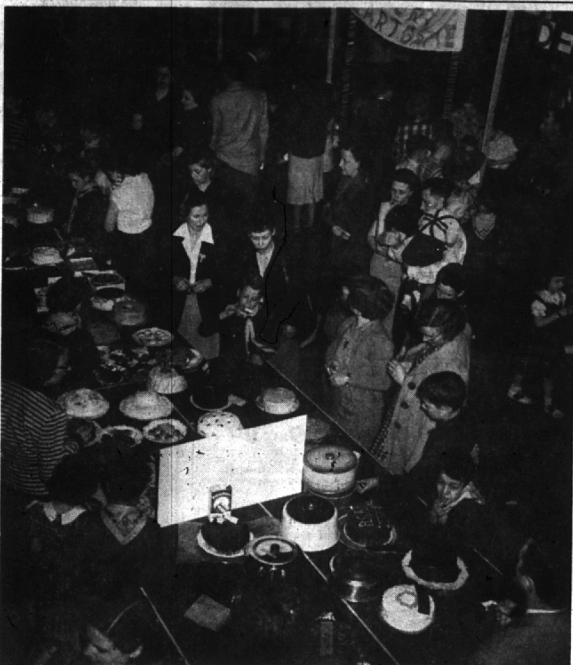

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
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
