**Technician Tells Residents What Blood Tags Mean**  
In answer to the hundreds of questions which have been received, Mrs. Mary Terry, technician at the Birmingham Clinical Laboratory, has prepared an explanation of the blood type tags received in Birmingham two weeks ago.  
Tags were mailed directly from Lansing to those who participated in the blood typing campaign here last November and December.  
Mrs. Terry pointed out that blood is classified into four main groups, A, B, AB and O.  
"For transfusion purposes," she explained, "donors may give blood to those in their own groups or to those of the AB group. Those of group O (universal) may be given to all groups."  
"However, even though all other factors are favorable, Rh positive cannot be given to an Rh negative blood type," she said.  
"Rh refers to a factor present in human cells as discovered in 1940. Further studies have shown that there are three different speculations of the Rh factor in humans."  
"The two which were determined in blood typing program here were the D and C factors. These can be both negative or both positive or a combination of the two."  
Mrs. Terry pointed out, "Questions or problems concerning this should be referred to the family physician, the only person qualified to answer that question."
