Kirbert Receives 10-Year Pin

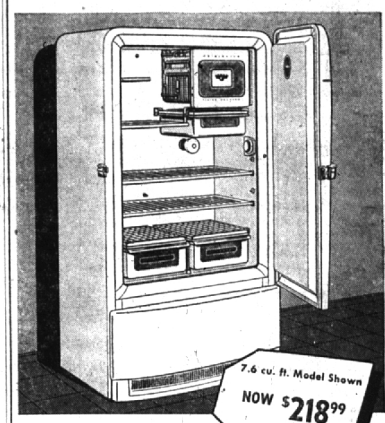
