Roland W. Reese Seeks Term On Local Board of Education

A former member of the Birmingham board of education, Roland W. Reese, 1847 Webster, is a candidate for one of the two positions on this group in the June 11 school board election.

Active in city affairs, he is now director of the chamber of commerce, treasurer of the Birmingham Credit Bureau; member of the advisory committee for the United Foundations for this area; co-chairman of the Halloween party; member of the planning commission's board of committees; father vice-president of the PTA council and member of the Little League baseball committee.

Reese said, "I have been asked why I became a candidate for these positions on the board of education after serving a previous term. I have several reasons, not the least of these are: children ages eight and nine, now in the elementary schools."

"I desire my children and all other children in the district to have as good an educational plan as we parents can possibly provide. I also feel that a sound educational structure improves the status of Birmingham as a city and school district and provides a feeling of pride in its citizens."

He pointed out, "During my previous term on the board of education, I recognized several programs in the school system that were weak, particularly the physical high school student loan association, and eight years with boy scout work. He organized the Seascoutship, Hunter and served on the interim board of the chamber of commerce in its organization."

In addition to his four years on the board of education from 1945 to 1950, he served with the Sideline Quarterbacks, and one term on the city recreation board and conducted programs for the Adams PTA.

Reese stated, "Because of these and my practical business experience as owner and operator of a retail store, my background of experience has been typical Birmingham and qualifies me to bring the board valuable information and practical solutions to many problems that can only be had by living with them daily."

HE ADDED, "As a result of my many activities, during 20 years in civic, social and business activities, I have acquired a valuable knowledge of our problems."
