

Garbage, Rubbish Authority Hires Engineering Firm

Designs and plans for the incinerator for the SDC garbage and rubbish authority will be made by the Greeley and Hansen consulting engineering firm.

This company was engaged by the directors of the authority last week. Cost of the incinerator has been estimated at around \$1,000,000.

Birmingham and Southfield township are included in the municipalities signed up in the authority.

Right-of-Way Purchase

Right-of-way property at 1158 West Maple, adjacent to the Quanton property, has been purchased by the City of Birmingham for \$5,000. Mayor Dagn Reier and City Clerk Irene Hanley were authorized by commissioners to execute the agreement between the city and the property owners.

REASONING REQUESTS STATED FOR PUBLIC HEARING IN SOUTHFIELD

A new classification known as regional shopping zone for Southfield township's zoning ordinance will be considered at a public hearing called by the township board for Thursday, Nov. 8, at 8 p.m. at Southfield 10 school, 10 Mile and Berg roads.

The proposed regional shopping zone would have a minimum size of 25 acres, and no building could be constructed with less than 7500 cubic feet in content.

Another item on the hearing's agenda will be consideration of the J. L. Hudson's company's request to rezone two parcels of land in the southeast section of the township from residential (three minimum size of homes 10,000 cubic feet) to commercial zone (business use), to the proposed regional shopping zone.

The township zoning ordinance to govern removal of trees in the township also will be taken up.

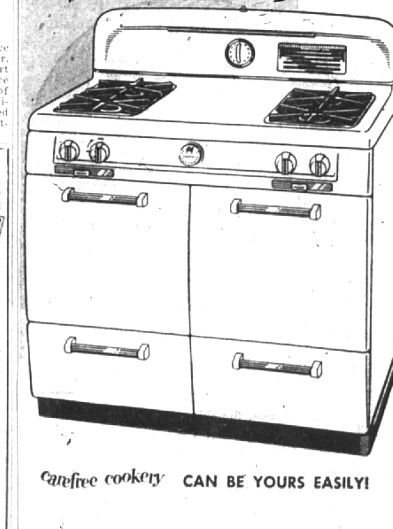
