The new plan enables groups to sponsor a blood bank, sending a portion of collections to the military, reserving the remainder for persons designated by the group.

\$14,000 Appropriated To Redeem Sewer Bonds

Over 1,000 Girl Scouts Here

Each year 200 Girl Scouts last June were invested with the high rank for which they have aimed and worked through the year. Mrs. James Abbott, president of the Birmingham Girl Scout Council, presented the Curved Bar, Girl Scouting's highest award, to 252 girls.

At the Court of Awards held each year at the beginning of Girl Scout Week in October, this is a national custom in honor of Juliette Low, founder of Girl Scouting, and emphasizes the world friendship for which each Girl Scout strives.
