Rev. Frank Kraft Dies in Wyoming

Former rector of St. James Episcopal church, the Rev. Frank Fenton Kraft, 77, died Monday in Rawlins, Wyo. He collapsed Sunday morning, immediately after the close of church services.

Mr. Kraft came to Birmingham in 1909, remaining here until he entered military service in 1917. He served missions at Royal Oak and Rochester, also.

Before going to Rawlins in 1924, he served in parishes in Washington, D. C., Philadelphia, Muncie, Ind., and Palestine, Tex. He has been chaplain of the Wyoming state penitentiary for 27 years.

Mr. Kraft is survived by his

widow, the former Helen T. Hubert, and four children.

Services were held from St. Thomas church Wednesday afternoon with burial in Rawlins.
