Cranbrook Museum Holds Exhibition

An exhibit of the work of Alexander Archipenko opened November 9 at the Museum of Cranbrook Academy of Art, and will continue through November 26. The exhibition consists of drawings and prints, and examples of Archipenko's sculpture in metal and plastic.

Archipenko is a Russian by birth, coming to this country in the Twenties. He is teaching at present.

HE WAS ONE of the pioneers in the modern sculpture movement, and is considered by many to have had much the same significance in this art as Picasso has had in painting.

Archipenko's early work was strongly influenced by Cubism, but he has since developed a more personal style which is particularly notable for its constant experiment with the problem of negative space.
