The bride repeated her vows in a gown of pure white chandilly lace over duchesse satin. The sleeveless, fitted bodice was designed with a traditional heart-shaped neckline, delicately traced with iridescent paillettes.

Her bouffant skirt flared from the diminutive pointed waistline in many gathers, and spread to a wide court train.

A PRINCESS CAP, bordered with applique of chantly lace roses etched in the paillettes, held in place her filmy illusion veil which cascaded to formal length beyond her train. She carried white orchids and stephanotis.


After an extended honeymoon Mr. and Mrs. David Wellington Porter will make their home at Michigan.
