Bobby Sintz was nine years old on Nov. 1, but had his party on Saturday. He took a group of his friends to the show in Birmingham.

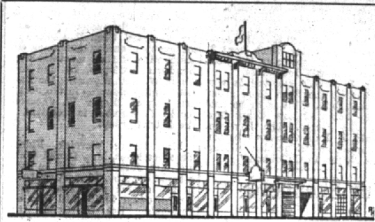
Walnut Lake Briefs

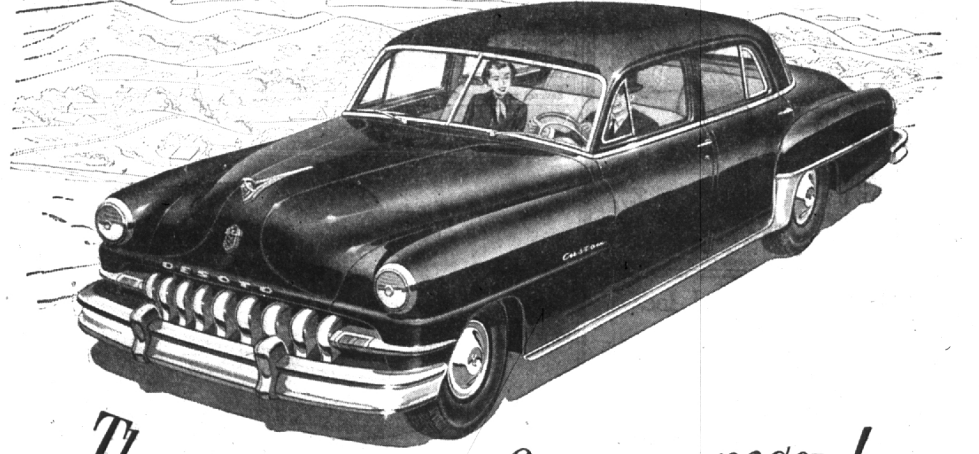
