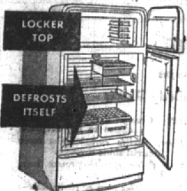

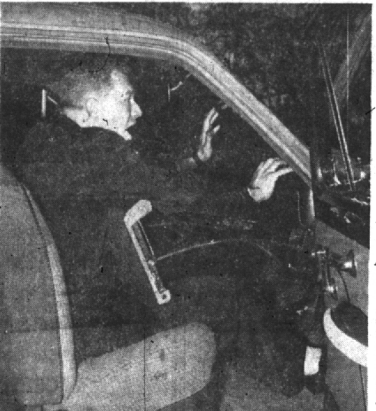

Is This Invention Answer To Fewer Auto Fatalities?

That too successful hitch hiker, death, can be banished from the front seat of the family car, claims a Bloomfield Hills man.

John J. Chika, of West Long Lake Road, says his Safe-T-Table can take this unwelcome passenger out of your car, pleasantly and easily.

At the same time, the combination gives you a reading or vanity table and a handy storage place for maps, trip logs, a quick snack, or even can be used as a vanity table. In a moment it can be made into a comfortable front seat crib for the baby, protecting the little guy just as it does the adult in the event of a collision.

The Safe-T-Table is not for autos alone, but can be used in trains and planes as well, he pointed out. It is attractive and so simple in its operation it is hard to understand why it was not perfected years ago.

THE TABLE was planned by Chika to become a part of new model cars, but since new model production has been curtailed, will be put on the market for installation in any car, as an accessory.

The passenger sitting beside the driver simply pulls the Safe-T-Table toward him. There are 120 ways in which its padded top can be adjusted to give complete body comfort. No matter how violently the passenger is thrown against it, the Safe-T-Table will not permit his being thrown against the windshield or instrument panel, and yet he has freedom of movement and no annoying pressure, Chika claims.

Unlike straps or belts, the passenger in the car should it crash. Conscious, he can slip free; unconscious, he can be removed in a moment, without fumbling with buckles or hooks.

THE SAFE-T-TABLE, attractively finished to match interior car design, folds snugly against the panel when not in use, and in

no way hampers the passenger in getting in or out of the car. It is supported by two curved, metal pipes, notched to hold in a ratchet-type lock.

Chika says of it, "It will also help the driver, in case of a crash, because it keeps the seat from being driven forward on him. The passenger, using the table, cannot lean head or chest into the front of the car, nor can he be thrown out a restraint in hand in case of a sudden stop."

He has tested the table by placing a dummy behind it and crashing a truck head-on into trees. Not once, he said, could he see that the dummy had struck the front of the car.

Chika has been an automotive designer with Detroit auto companies for years and is now associated with Advance Design Developments in Bloomfield Hills.

"I think I have the solution to making the 'suicide seat' safe," Chika says. "Since the curtailment of new models, I decided the Safe-T-Table should be put on the market now and not kept for some future date. Death won't wait for new models."

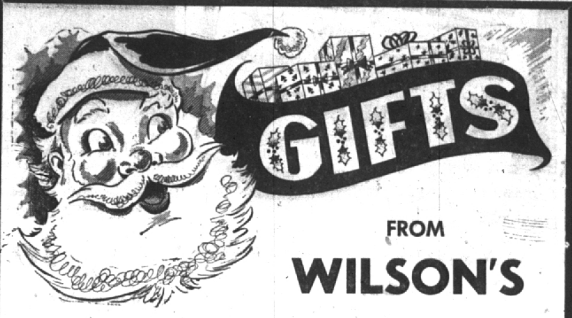
