Sign up for College Board Examinations

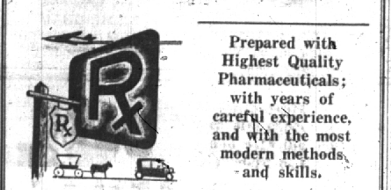

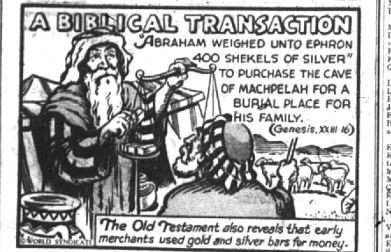

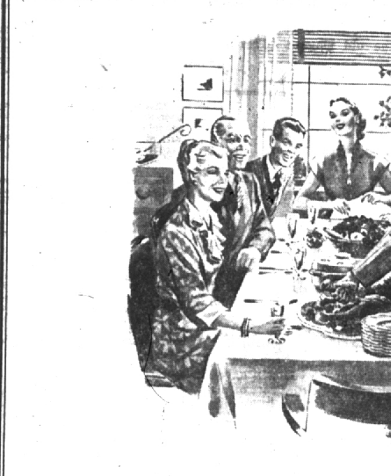
