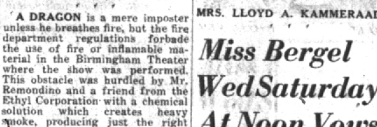

De Pair Infantry Chorus To Appear Saturday, Dec. 1st



The De Pair Infantry Chorus, which will appear under the auspices of the Community Concert Association of Southern Oakland County, is making its second appearance by popular demand. The performance is scheduled for 8:15 Saturday evening, December 1, at the Royal Oak High School Auditorium.

This group of thirty-five tuneful veterans sang for American troops from two times to Berlin, and is the most important concert attraction to emerge from World War II.

Following the war, these men remained together as a unit under Captain Leonard de Pair's direction, and are now making their fifth civilian concert tour of more than 150 appearances. Their annual concert in Carnegie Hall takes place in January.

THE de PAIR Chorus was organized within the 372nd Infantry Regiment at Fort Dix, N. J., in 1942, and gave more than 2,000 concerts for American armed forces in their three year travels. To the men of the armed forces, this chorus of singing soldiers was a memorable attraction, and it was their enthusiasm that inspired the decision to stay together as a concert unit after the war.

THE GROUP'S DIRECTOR, Leonard de Pair, was born 16 years ago in Summit, New Jersey. He graduated from Columbia University and the Institute of Musical Arts, and the Roark Bradford-Jacques Wolfe play, "John Henry."

He enlisted in the Army as a private and rose to the rank of captain. In 1944 he organized and led the chorus, which was one of the features of Mow Hart's AAF stage play, "Winged Victory."

THE AVERAGE MEMBER of the chorus is 32, and a bachelor. Twenty members are college graduates. Four are taking advanced degrees.
