

### Recreation Ideas Cited By Director

The last undesirable point mentioned was placing entertainment into recreation program. He stressed that a program should not be directed toward one final event such as pageants, etc.

In listing his ideas for a program, Whitney pointed out that children have a need for self-expression such as participation in radio workshop and craft activities.

HE STATED, "When they leave for the day, the expressions on the participants' faces show the need has been met. They have a need for release of physical energy and are hungry to develop their basic skills."

The director mentioned that to provide some artistic outlets for persons who wish to create things with their hands.

Whitney said that next year Birmingham residents will spend \$20,133 to have their garbage pails kept empty. This expenditure will equal approximately \$1 per person.

He added, "For our recreation program, the average amount spent will be about fifty cents a person."

He concluded by telling Rotary members to let the City Recreation board know whenever they have any ideas or suggestions concerning the recreation program.

Four dangerous points in the promotion of a recreation program were cited by Frank Whitney, city recreation director, in a speech at Monday's Rotary Club meeting.

The undesirable factors mentioned by Whitney are: (1) use of attendance figures in stressing the success of a program; (2) belief that recreation is a cure for delinquency; (3) the stressing of the professional aspect of sports; and (4) entertainment being worked into recreation.

The director pointed out that a good test for a recreation program shouldn't include use of attendance figures.

IN STATING THAT recreation isn't a cure for delinquency, Whitney said, "Recreation may prevent considerable delinquency, but it's not a cure for all of it. If we can get the participants when they're young and keep them on the playground and give them something wholesome to do, we can help considerably."

Whitney added, "Recreation authorities shouldn't try to have their program devoted to developments of special skills. By doing this they put too much emphasis on ultimate professional development."
