The 27 points scored by Birmingham in defeating Royal Oak were the most ever scored by a Maple team in the Thanksgiving Day classic. It also tied the record set by Royal Oak in 1941.

Tom Tracy's three touchdowns enabled him to win the defensive crown for class B and A. He ended the season with 22 touchdowns and 22 conversions for 154 points.

In selections made by The Detroit Times, Tom Tracy gained first string honors on both all-league and all-suburban teams. Gordon Mutch and Tom Rickelman also made the all-league squad. The all-state team has not yet been selected.

SEASONAL STATISTICS showed that the Maples gained 2,044 yards and held opponents to 833 yards. Tracy was the leading ground gainer with 964 yards in 104 tries for an average of 9.27 per carry.
