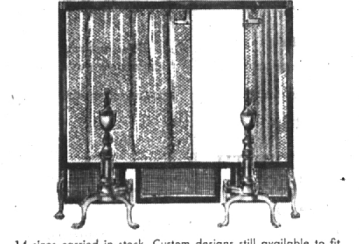
The second dance of the season of the Riverside Dance club was held last Saturday at the Plum Hollow Golf club.
