Canadian Crash Fatal to Three

Services for three Royal Oak persons killed in a highway crash near Kingville, Ont., Friday night Monday from the Bell chapel of the William R. Hamilton funeral home. Donald MacGregor, 56, his wife Leona, 53, and his mother, Mrs. Louise MacGregor, 80, all of 1002 Housatonic, Royal Oak, died after their car apparently went out of control on a slippery highway. Police, who said they could not determine who had been driving the car, said the Donald MacGregor died instantly. The elder Mrs. MacGregor died in a nearby hospital a few hours later.

The only survivors are a daughter, Louise MacGregor, a student at Principia college, Elmhurst, Ill., and Mrs. Donald MacGregor's brother, Cecil T. Goodwill of Detroit.

The service was in charge of Hyland Flint of the First Church of Christ, Scientist, Birmingham, of which the family were members. Interment was in Roseland Park cemetery.
