**Land Use Report Given by Troy Zoning Comm.**  
Annual meeting of the Troy township zoning commission was held Tuesday evening.  
In the land use report, agricultural land in the township covers 14,188 acres or 70%; residential one, two, three and four, 5,196 acres (25%); commercial B-1, B-2, 127 acres, 5/10%; industrial, 680 acres, 2.5%; and miscellaneous which includes recreation areas, school and cemeteries, 398 acres (2%).  
There is a total of 220,600 acres in use.  
Commission members also stated in the report that they intend to request the township board to appropriate funds to retain a planner.  
**THE REPORT CITED** the need for a new business use classification known as B-3. This would accommodate fringe area lands, and areas subject to the influence of neighboring communities.  
Commission also passed a resolution requesting the township board to recognize a state of emergency for 60 days, during which time no proprietary plat subdivisions will be approved. The commission desires this period to complete a residential land use inventory for the township.  
In other business, members of the North Adams protective association appeared and requested that the commission limit the size of lots in their area to one acre, until such time as sewer and water services are available.  
This matter was tabled by the commission for further study.

**Special Hearing Set for J. L. Hudson Rezoning Request**  
The Southfield township zoning board has set Thursday, Nov. 1, for a special hearing to consider the rezoning request of the J. L. Hudson Co.  
The firm owns two parcels of land in the southeast section of the township and has asked that the zoning be changed to "shopping zone."  
The zoning board considered this matter at last week's meeting and set the hearing date.

**Emergency Radio Test Scheduled Here Sunday**  
Members of the inter-county amateur radio emergency network will conduct a simulated emergency test Sunday, Oct. 14 at 3 p.m., according to James F. Abbott, 763 Lakeside, emergency coordinator for communications in the Birmingham area.  
Birmingham's base control station, W8BZ, located in the St. James Episcopal church, will be manned for this drill by local amateurs.  
**THE AREA'S NET CONTROL** station, W8BZ, which is housed in a specially built 27-foot trailer, also will be in Birmingham. The station has been built and completely equipped by the Briggs Manufacturing Co. and donated to the Detroit area amateurs in the interest of civil defense.  
This trailer-station which will be used Sunday will be parked on Chester street in front of the high school and will be open for public inspection from noon until the completion of the drill.  
Members of the local civil defense and Red Cross organizations and the police department have been invited to observe the drill.  
Abbott stated the test will be one of hundreds conducted throughout the nation by local units of the National Amateur Emergency corps this week-end.

**Two Local Taxi Companies Request Additional Licenses**  
Birmingham's two taxi cab companies, Veterans and Birmingham Cab have each requested two additional licenses.  
The firms have agreed to purchase the assets and licenses of the Star Cab Co. pending federal court approval and approval of the city attorney. The Star firm now is in bankruptcy.  
City Attorney Forbes S. Hascall believes licenses are non-transferable but the companies can apply for new licenses. Hearing on the revocation of the Star licenses has been continued for two more weeks until federal approval is obtained on the sale.  
In the meantime, Hascall will check into the legality of transferring the licenses to the two companies.
