

# VAUGHAN SCHOOL NEWS



## Crane Gridders Drop 21-7 Tilt To Lake Forest

Cranbrook school's varsity football team took its first loss of the season Saturday when Lake Forest Academy of Chicago won 21-7.

In the first quarter, Lake Forest's quarter-back, Jack Weston, scored on a line plunge after a series of pass completions. The second score came shortly afterwards on a pass from Weston to Jim Stebbins. Following these two touchdowns, the teams fought evenly throughout the game.

Cranbrook's lone score came early in the third period when John Edson passed 45 yards to half-back Mark Smith, who scampered 25 more yards for the touchdown. Edson faked an extra point kick and again passed to Smith for the extra point, making the score 14-7.

**SOON AFTERWARD** Cranbrook fumbled on its own 20 yard line and Lake Forest was able to score on a short end run play. Weston converted for his third successful try.

In the last quarter, Cranbrook marched for 70 yards on successive passes from Edson and Bob Newey to Smith until Smith was tackled hard by three men from the Lake Forest team and was knocked unconscious. This stopped Cranbrook's final drive.

Cranbrook will journey to Cleveland, Ohio to play against University School in its third game of the season Saturday.

### Barnum 8th Grade Football Team Defeats Hazel Park
