Suggests City Consider Ann Arbor Selling Ordinance

In a letter to the city commission, J. P. Temple, 18906 Bedford, Beverly Hills, in charge of Michigan sales for the Electrofax Corp., suggested the city consider the ordinance adopted by the city of Ann Arbor concerning door-to-door selling.

He pointed out that Ann Arbor recently passed an ordinance which doesn't hurt legitimate business but still restricts the "gyppers" and "fly by night" salesmen from unreliable companies.
Temple mentioned that his company has suggested this ordinance

to other cities intending to pass such ordinance.
While City Attorney Forbes S. Russell redrafts it. Meanwhile, Temple's suggestions are filed until the matter again is taken up.
