### Action Tabled On Springdale Park Building

City commission action concerning a new building for Springdale Park has been tabled until the Oct. 22 meeting. At Monday evening's session City Manager Donald C. Egebert recommended that he be authorized to secure proposals for construction of the building, which is estimated to cost \$13,700. However, Commissioner Ralph Main asked that the matter be tabled for two weeks so that he can look over plans in more detail. The proposed structure will provide space for concessions, sales room and storage of equipment. Plans call for about 60% of the space to be devoted toward storage facilities.

### Wants to Build Loading Dock Over Utility Easement

Neostyle, Inc., industrial contract packagers, have asked permission to construct a loading dock over a utility easement owned by the City of Birmingham. The proposed building will be located on Cole, east of Eton road, and would necessitate the construction of a loading dock along a railroad spur. A company representative said the dock would be built to permit proper maintenance of the utilities. It is described as having a sand fill base and four-inch concrete slab top. A fence will pass over the easement area, in addition to the proposed dock, the spokesman said. The company has said it will assume any costs should the city find it necessary to go through the dock in the maintenance and repair of the water and sewer mains in the easement. City Engineer L. R. Gate and City Attorney Forbes Hascall have been asked to draw up an agreement and present it at next week's commission meeting for official action.

### THE CITY MANAGER stated

"Considering present day building costs, we have combined the equipment building with the needed sales space and the building designed to serve this dual purpose is a minimum type structure." Egebert pointed out that the city intends to move the pump to clear the right-of-way for 16 Mile road and can continue to utilize the present watering system for maintenance of the golf course. He said, "The watering system is not adequate, and we are involved in unnecessary labor cost due to the lack of adequacy in our watering system. However, it is our opinion that the new building is more urgent inasmuch as we do not have any adequate storage building at the park." City officials believe that the present watering system can be continued for a few more years until the building need is the most urgent at present.

### Group to Consider Future Budget Needs

Birmingham YMCA committee of management will meet Monday evening to consider budget needs when it moves into its new quarters, review its fall membership run-up, and start plans for the spring campaign when it hopes to increase membership to 1300. Formal acceptance of the Birmingham Junior Chamber of Commerce's offer to work on equipment will be made. A nominating committee to fill vacancies on the committee and elect new members for 1952 also will be appointed. Birmingham YMCA is supported through contributions to the United Foundation drive of Detroit.

### Village Team Downs Poppleton

Playing before 150 parents and friends, the Bloomfield Village Gray-Y team sporting full football equipment, defeated Poppleton 26-13. Bloomfield Village moved out in front when Pete Jackson drove over right tackle for 14 yards and a touchdown in the first quarter. Bill Ganner's try for the extra point was good. In the second quarter, Henry Barblow ran 20 yards and put the ball in scoring position for Jackson's second touchdown.

### Chesterfield Sidewalk Work Will Be Pushed

City Manager D. C. Egebert told commissioners Monday night that the engineering department and DPW were making every effort to secure sidewalk replacement and repair on Chesterfield as rapidly as possible. He said special emphasis will be given the walk just north of West Maple area, where pedestrians are forced to enter traffic lanes in order to avoid mud holes. Egebert, with City Attorney Forbes Hascall, are continuing to study the request of W. S. Spiegel, 465 Chesterfield, to have a parcel of unplatted land he owns for a sidewalk in front of his home. Egebert and Hascall are to determine whether or not Spiegel owns to the middle of Chesterfield.
