Needlework Guild Sets Date For Ingathering

The Birmingham-Bloomfield Executive Board of the Needlework Guild of America has, in several recent sessions, mapped out a full agenda for its fall program.
 Mrs. Benjamin Brewster again heads the Guild's organization, which now embraces thirteen hundred members grouped under ninety-six directors. Fourteen section presidents are responsible for the collection and tabulation of the three thousand and more new garments that have poured into the recent Ingatherings.
 ON THE EXECUTIVE BOARD working towards the Annual Ingathering Day, November 13, at the Birmingham Community House are Mrs. William H. Breech, corresponding secretary; Mrs. William F. Thomas, Jr., assistant corresponding secretary; and Mrs. Carl W. Whirl, treasurer.
 Mrs. William L. Graham, whose mother founded the Battle Creek branch of the N. G. A., and who consequently has been active for many years, is a re-elected vice-president.
 Mrs. Glen R. Miller has been appointed chairman of all activities concerning the Ingathering.
 PUBLICITY CHAIRMAN Mrs. Kenneth McGregor will continue to edit the biannual News Bulletin. This bulletin was very favorably received at the National Conference in Philadelphia, and was one of the instrumental factors in gaining a representative place for the Birmingham-Bloomfield branch on the National Board.
 Mrs. Robert N. Woodruff, third vice-president in charge of distribution, announces that, to date, the following local agencies will benefit from the 1951 collection of garments: the Contagious Hospital of Oakland County, the Oakland County Juvenile Home; and the St. Joseph Mercy Hospital clinic.
 Also to receive garments are the Birmingham Health department; the Southern Oakland County Welfare Commission, and the American Red Cross.
 Mrs. Woodruff explains that "it is only natural that fully one-fourth of our garments should go to the Red Cross, since the Needlework Guild and the American Red Cross are officially affiliated, and have shared many years of co-operation and effort together."
