Troy Township Has 31 Torch Drive Volunteers

Residents of Troy township will have the opportunity to prove they "have a heart" as the 1951 United Foundation Torch drive, the greatest fund raising campaign in the history of South Oakland county, gets underway.

An organization of 31 volunteer workers will contact industries, business firms and individuals, offering an opportunity to "Give Once For All" to support 150 charitable agencies. The period of Oct. 16 to Nov. 8 has been set for the raising of Troy township's quota of \$46,538. Last year residents of the community contributed \$47,889.

The GOAL OF \$11,666,000 has been set for Detroit and suburban areas to support the 150 charitable organizations. These agencies include the Red Cross, homes for youngsters and oldsters, a score of hospitals, the Salvation Army, the USO, to name but a few.

They are the means through which the persons of this area "take care of their own." They step in when disaster strikes—polio, heart disease, cancer and scores of other ailments which plague civilization. They provide guidance for young, care for the old and have to be the warm heart of a progressive metropolitan area.

Residents of Detroit and suburban areas are being asked to give more generously than ever before because the cost of operating these agencies has increased with the cost of living during the past year. In addition, four more agencies have been carefully screened and found worthy of support by the United Foundation.

MEN IN SERVICE

Local Reservists In Inspection at Grosse Ile Base

GROSSE ILE, Mich. — Forty Naval and Marine Air reservists from the Birmingham area will be in formation at Grosse Ile Naval Air Station, Wednesday evening, Oct. 24, to receive their annual military inspection by the Chief of Naval Air Reserve Training and the Commander of Marine Air Reserve Training.

Rear Admiral Lucian A. Moebs, Chief of Naval Air Reserve Training and Colonel V. J. McCann, Commander of Air Reserve Training for the Marines will conduct the inspection which will take place in the main hangar at 8 p.m.

GROSSE ILE, ONE OF 23 stations throughout the country engaged in training of air reserve personnel, is responsible for the training of more than 2,000 reservists. Officers and men of the Naval and Marine squadrons report one week-end each month for drills in the States. Station to maintain their combat ready status.

Since the outbreak of hostilities in Korea, Grosse Ile has provided three squadrons for active duty, two Marine and one Navy. The Marine squadrons are now on duty in Korea and the Navy squadron, a Patrol Squadron, has just recently returned from a tour of duty in the Philippines.
