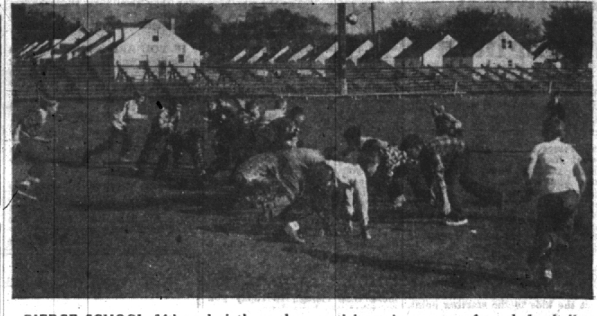

Cranebrook's Varsity football squad lost to a stronger and more organized University School of Cleveland team 53-25 last Saturday in Shaker Heights, Ohio. U.S. gained a touchdown three minutes after the opening kickoff on a reverse play from center-field. Cranebrook followed immediately with a long down-field drive which netted in a score by Mark Smith, but failing to make the extra point. U.S. lead 7-6. University's second touchdown late in the first period put the score at 14-6. U.S. scored three in the second period leaving Cranebrook behind by four scores. With the score 33-6 at the half-time, Cranebrook rallied briefly for two more ties on a passing attack by John Edson to end Bill Truettner and Ned Bearden spiriting this late offense. Sophomore Bearden scored twice on passes received from Edson.
