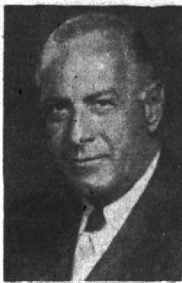
## Noted Commentator At Town Hall on Oct. 31

## 'Fritz' Crisler Is Hi-12 Speaker

H. O. (Fritz) Crisler, sports director for the University of Michigan, will speak at the Oct. 29 dinner meeting of the Birmingham High Twelve.

Crisler came to Michigan in 1938 and was Wolverine coach for ten years, during which the team won two western conference titles and one Rose Bowl title.

In 1947 he was named "Coach of the Year", and although since his retirement from active coaching in 1948, Crisler has maintained a keen interest in the sport. He is chairman of the NCAA rules committee.

Crisler was graduated from the University of Chicago where he was outstanding in football, basketball and baseball.

During World War II he headed a five-man athletic group to the Canal Zone and other areas. This summer he headed a football clinic for the army at Garmisch, Germany.

Harold Watt, former University of Michigan center, will introduce Crisler. Orzie Clark, Michigan coach, will narrate the movie of a current game which Crisler will present.
