Planners Voice No Objections To Troy Plat

Birmingham plan Troy township zoning board that they have no objections to a proposed plat for Pine Hills subdivision at the northeast corner of Adams and Wattles roads.

Troy township Clerk Clifton Truesdell asked the zoning board for a statement concerning this project because the property is within the Birmingham school district and is bounded in part by the River Rouge.

Earlier this summer Troy's zoning board turned down plans for the plat because of the arrangements for septic tanks. However, since then the developers, Robertson Brothers, have made adjustments which are satisfactory to state health authorities.

COVERT ROBERTSON announced at Thursday's meeting and answered a number of questions from plan board members. The property includes 88 acres and will have 180 lots and each lot will be a little less than one-half acre. Robertson stated the homes will be in the \$15,000-\$17,000 class. Plan board suggested to the Troy zoning board that either disposal units or incinerators be required.

The Troy zoning commission also notified the board for William F. Dohany has applied for rezoning of a one-half mile long parcel of land running along Derby road from Eton to Coolidge highway for commercial use. The plan board will meet with the Troy zoning commission in the next few weeks and discuss zoning definitions and zoning ordinances. At present, the industrial zoning classifications for Troy and Birmingham are slightly different.
