

# Group Hopes to Curb Juvenile Delinquency

In efforts to help curb juvenile delinquency and provide a summer camp for under-privileged children, a group of interested residents of the county, including many from the Birmingham area have formed an organization called Camp Oakland, Inc.

This non-profit group operates in conjunction with the children's division of Probate court. Plans call for the purchase of a permanent site of more than 150 acres which will have adequate farm buildings and lake frontage.

HE ADDED THAT he hopes the project will serve as a "pilot program" to lead toward a Michigan Youth Corrections act and to similar programs for this age group in other areas of the state.

Other than the farm work program, officials plan to provide a summer camping program for younger boys and girls up to the ages of 15 years. Youngsters will be those who are under-privileged, financially or otherwise, to the extent that they can't be cared for in any other existing summer camp.

The year-round vocational plan is for boys between 15 and 17 who have lost interest in school but are able to further their education in a vocational program. In addition, these facilities will be available to juvenile court for use of boys who are unable to remain in their own homes.
