**Southfield Plan Work Authorized**  
 With a view to the future, Southfield township board Tuesday evening approved an outline of a master plan work program for 1951-52, as submitted by the plan commission.  
 Under the plan, David S. Geer, East Long Lake road, Bloomfield Hills, will make a study of conditions in the township. Cost of the work will be \$3,250, and will be paid from the \$5,500 appropriation to the Plan commission.  
 INCLUDED IN GEER'S work will be studies of water supply, traffic conditions, population, land use, pilot drainages, economic background and preliminary master plan sketches.  
 Orrin S. Gulley, 19068 Riverdale drive, Beverly Hills, plan commission chairman, appeared at the meeting and explained his group's work.  
 Gulley stated, "It takes quite some time to prepare a master plan. This is especially true in Southfield, because such work has never been attempted before. Eventually we'll have a plan which will be used for the next 10 to 20 years. However, it will take years of study to complete."  
 Gulley emphasized that the master plan will "provide in addition for what will happen in the future." He stated when the plan is completed, the township will
