**Lower Fire Losses Aim Of Program**

In spite of its low fire loss average of \$1.23 per capita last year, Birmingham is taking steps to make that figure even lower.

National Fire Prevention week will be highlighted here by a special Fire Prevention Day, when engineers from the state association will visit the city.

More than 250 business places will be given a complete check, and fire hazards listed. The entire program is voluntary, with the inspectors visiting only nine cities each year on an invitational basis.

"Birmingham's fire average is exceptionally low," a spokesman said, "but one bad fire in the business district could skyrocket it. We feel our own department is doing an excellent job of fire prevention, and this mass inspection is no reflection on their ability."

"CHECK by these fire prevention experts will merely be a double effort to prevent any disaster from striking our business area."

"One thing this group of state officials will stress is that every day should be fire inspection and fire prevention day if a really complete job is to be done."

The National Board of Fire Underwriters has reported that 11,000 persons die in fires each year and that a fire breaks out every 36 seconds.

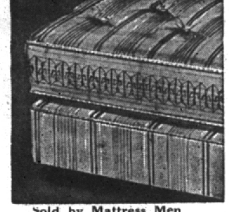

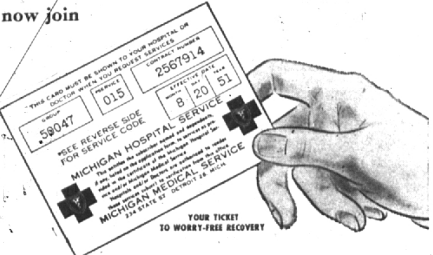
