Tree Planting on Fall Forestry Dept. Agenda

Fall program of the city forestry department includes planting of three to four hundred trees, mostly hard maples, according to City Forester Bill Lebold. Most of the trees will be placed in front of new homes on Derby, Eton and South Bates streets. The department has a long backlog of requests, Lebold said.

Tree planting will begin in October after the first hard frosts. We hope to take care of each tree once every eight or 10 years. However, we can't hope to reach that goal yet.

Fall work also includes trimming to clear around stop and speed signs, traffic signals and intersections.

THE DEPARTMENT this summer handled a number of special jobs. These included around the Quanton lake dam, Derby well site and Adams-Bowers fire hall site.

The forester said, "We cleared the fire hall site of weeds and brush and then plowed, graded and seeded the area. In addition, we hope to take care of each tree once every eight or 10 years. However, we can't hope to reach that goal yet."

Lebold stated, "We're three months behind in filling tree trimming requests. After these jobs are completed we get underway on the street tree trimming program."

He added, "The forestry department is responsible for about 12,000 to 13,000 trees. Eventually

the department filled in and graded around the Derby well. It will soon be seeded there."

The forestry crew also repaired and seeded areas this summer following construction of sidewalk and new pavement.
