Park Building Plans Discussed By Commission

City Manager Donald C. Egbert has been authorized by the city commission to secure construction drawings from the architect for the proposed Springdale Park building.

The park has been in need of a structure since the clubhouse burned down several years ago. The building will probably be constructed of rinder block with a simple frame roof. Architect Edgell will submit the structure will cost approximately eleven to twelve thousand dollars.

It would be erected at approximately the same site as the present temporary structure. The building will be 30 by 48 feet, with a small porch in front of the portion open to the public.
