Opening Program Of Great Books Group Is Held

First in the current Great Books sessions was held at Baldwin public library Wednesday night under the direction of Edward W. Reid and James E. Tobin, leaders of one group and F. R. Batzli and Charles N. Blunt leading the second.

The opening assignment was the Book of Job and Aeschylus' "Prometheus Bound".

The topic for Oct. 3 will be Plato's "Symposium".

Miss Jeanne Lloyd, head librarian, said the books are selected by the Great Books foundation of Chicago. There are hundreds of such groups throughout the country with thousands of members.

There is no fee or obligation to this activity, Miss Lloyd explained. "If they wish, participants may purchase their books at a nominal fee from the foundation. These books are inexpensive, paperback pocket size editions, handily bound."

Area residents, she pointed out, are free to visit any meeting to become better acquainted with the activity before actually joining.

"THE GROUPS will try to contact personnel in local industry this year," Miss Lloyd said, "to inform them of the work being done and enlist their membership and participation."

"Birmingham has grown so much during the year that there are some who may not know of these groups but would like to join them."

The library, as sponsor of the activity for three years, has had many favorable comments on the program. Persons engaged in daily businesses and housewives have all expressed their enjoyment of it and the benefit they have derived.

"Some have discovered that, although Plato, Aristotle and Thucydides wrote centuries ago, they were vexed by the same problems we face today."

"At the library we make no comment on the program other than to ask residents to come and see for themselves exactly what it is like."
